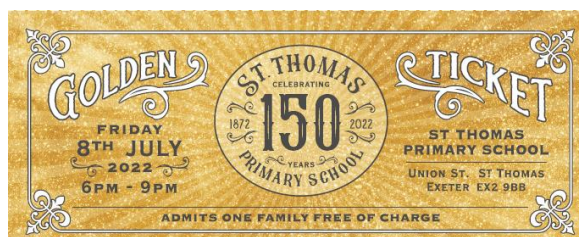
Photo fun
